



#### **Director's Notes**

I was drawn to *Quartet* for my first foray into directing by a number of features. It is warm and humorous, observing the frailties of its well-drawn and individual characters with sympathy as well as acuity. I am slightly surprised to find myself approaching the supposed age of those characters so am fully engaged in the play's consideration of the problems of aging. How much, as we get older, are we the same person we were twenty, thirty or forty years ago? How do we continue to live lives that are full and meaningful? I also love the theatre and the music of Verdi and particularly relished the challenge set by the ending of the play.

I have been enormously fortunate in having the support of a very talented team. Huge thanks to Sheana, who has been my mentor as well as Production Manager and has patiently answered many frantic emails over the past few months. Huge thanks, too, to the wonderful tech team and brilliant cast.



### **Rigoletto**

Rigoletto by Giuseppe Verdi, is based, as Reggie tells us, on a play by Victor Hugo, Le Roi s'Amuse. Both play and opera scandalised in their day with their plot of a lecherous king (a duke in the opera) aided and abetted in his many seductions by his jester, Rigoletto. Rigoletto has no qualms about his role in the ruin of so many women until his own daughter, Gilda, becomes involved. She falls in love with her seducer and, despite his



betrayal of her, eventually sacrifices her life to save his, leaving her father utterly broken. The king/duke, is untouched, quite unaware of the tragedy he has caused.

In the quartet, we witness the betrayal of Gilda. The duke is flirting with Maddalena, a barmaid, (unaware that her brother has been employed by Rigoletto to murder him). Outside the inn, Gilda has been brought by her father to learn the true nature of the man she has fallen in love with. She is heartbroken, hearing the duke utter the same vows and promises he has just made to her. Her father promises vengeance.



#### The Cast



**Jean** played by **Jo Barnard** — This is Jo's third show with Maskers, after playing Mrs Joe Gargery in *Great Expectations* and the Duchess in Wyrd Sisters, and she is delighted to find herself once again married to Eric – albeit fleetingly! She is also pleased that she found time to take a GCSE in Italian at evening school about 20 years ago because it is finally coming in useful. Lei spera che vi piace lo spettacolo.



Cissy played by Hazel Burrows— Hazel has been a Masker since the mid-70s, performing in a wide variety of roles - old men, very old women, servants, screaming wives. Americans, dominant mothers - to mention a few. In recent times, she has been either set painting or working as a director. Hazel directed **A Bunch of Amateurs** last May. a sell-out comedy with a team of fun-loving people. Bringing theatre into our community, getting people to laugh and see the funny side of life brings her enormous pleasure. Hazel is thrilled to be cast as Cissy Robson in this heart-warming, joyous play. Whilst learning the lines she has noticed the parallels between her life and this script, often hilarious and sometimes sad enough to make her weep. So, ladies and gentlemen, as the false teeth of time come away in the Granny Smith of destiny - enjoy!



Reggie played by Eric Petterson — Eric joined Maskers in 2012. He was Joe Gargery, Wemmick and Drummel, sometimes in the correct costume, in *Great Expectations*, and a particularly bolshie guard in Antigone. He was considered weird enough for Wyrd Sisters and was Len in pyjamas in Comfort me with Apples. Eric has just made his highly successful directorial debut with The Flint Street Nativity. He is looking forward to being married to Jo Barnard again (albeit for not very long).



Wilf played by Philip de Grouchy — Philip has been (type?) cast as usual as the loud-mouthed extrovert; in this case, Wilfred, a noisy baritone and thus, in the famous quartet, singing the eponymous hunchback, Rigoletto. Apart from any experience gained in wearing out not only the boards of many theatrical venues, but also the patience of numberless audiences in Southampton over the past 50 odd (!) years. his only qualification for this current role is being for forty years a member of Southampton Operatic Society. Have no fear, he will NOT be regaling us with any live operatic arias in this production - only some tuneless humming! He is looking forward to working in this intimate, four -hander play with such a talented company.
